### EVENTS of 2015:

In September we had the joy of welcoming Consuelo Mengual, the lay leader of the AFJM at international level, in order to spend some time working with Government General of the the Congregation. This provided an opportunity to reflect together on the different plans that we have for the Association.

In October, the General Conference, with the members of the General Government, the Provincial Superiors and two members of the council from the different provinces of the Congregation, took place in Rome. We spent one session with Consuelo Mengual, during which we explained the plans for the AFJM with a presentation of the different groups.



At present, we have 94 groups spread over 13 Provinces as well as the African Delegation 1670 members coming from all cultures, languages and very different realities. Being able to share this enriched all of us.

## Meeting AFJM Colombia december 2015

The AFJM in Colombia began in

1994. On the 1<sup>st</sup> September 1995, according to the statistics of the Congregation, there were two groups with 50 members who wished to live their baptismal promises in a radical way, as committed lay people according to **the charism of Claudine Thévenet.** They spent these first years being formed and strengthened by prayer, the study of the word of God and concretizing the spirit of solidarity in the form of projects and programmes for those most in need.

Then, other groups were set up in Medellin in the popular neighborhood of Castilla, in Santander Barrancabermeja and Cimitarra. The groups met together, some monthly, others twice monthly. It began with a deepening of their baptismal promises. The atmosphere of the meetings was warm. It's a very dynamic way of sharing not only faith, but also the charism, with those who share life, hopes and pain as well as the events of the country and the world all of which forms part of the history of salvation. Some groups base their meetings on the events of the liturgical year which contributes to personal and spiritual enrichment and is a sign of maturity in faith. They also celebrate together personal, social, regional and world events.

In 2004, there were 68 participants and in 2015 there are 105. Three national congresses have been held, all in Medellin city, the first in October 2004, with 33 members, the second in 2013 with 42 participants and the third in 2015 with 62 members.During each Congress the statutes were revised, the brochure "yeast, salt and light" was studied and this motivated many to make a concrete apostolic commitment. The Priorities from the General Chapter of 2013 were taken as the main theme of the two most recent Congresses thus reawakening the commitment of each of the members. Since 2010, a group of young people has been organized in order to set up a team of "AFJM Youth". At the end of 2013 this group was put in place and today they number 15; the majority of whom are graduates of the School for Faith and Joy Barrio Popula ire n° 1. Each meeting provides an opportunity where Claudine's life and charism is expressed and deepened through prayer and reflection and the desire to share with other young people whether in the work place or as students, the joy of knowing God and of being loved by Him.

For this reason, five of them take responsibility for catechism with those preparing for confirmation, and all of them make a difference in their work place, by



their personal commitment in line with what they do, by their spiritual life and by the joy which shows itself in action. Some, at the level of their professional lives, participate in social projects such as the entertainment of sick children in hospitals, visitation and accompaniment of refugees in need, training of youth leaders, care of the aged, promotion of the leadership of women and organization of recreational workshops for children and young people. We are working to motivate other young people to join the AFJM group and benefit from the charism left us as a legacy by Saint Claudine. The members of AFJM feel that they are the yeast which discreetly makes love grow right where they are: the salt which gives flavor, joy and meaning to the lives of those with whom they live, the light placed on a lampstand which radiates the goodness of God all around. cf. Mt. 13,33; 15, 13-14).
