TO ALL THE RELIGIOUS OF THE CONGREGATION AND COMPANIONS IN MISSION.

My dear Sisters and Companions in Mission,

Greetings from Rome.

Let me begin with a familiar story from Tony De Mello.

Once upon a time, a monk in his travels found a precious stone and kept it. One day he met a traveler, and when he opened his provisions with him, the traveler saw the pearl and asked the monk to give it to him. The monk did so readily. The traveler departed overjoyed with the unexpected gift of the precious stone that was enough to give him wealth and security for the rest of his life. However, a few days later he came in search of the monk, found him, gave him back the stone and entreated him: 'Now give me something much more precious than this stone, valuable as it is. Give me that which enabled you to give it to me.'

This is the Ignatian indifference we are called to aspire – an equanimity of soul, which is the fruit of the discernment of spirits and freedom from disordered attachments.

We could ask ourselves:

- What is the precious stone that I cling to, what am I afraid to give up?
- Where or what is God calling or inviting me to?
- How can I/we respond to the cries of today's world?

ASJM AT HOME – 2020



In March of this year, when the lock down had been decreed because of the Pandemic, we launched the "HOLY WEEK AT HOME".


The Proposal was to send, every day of the Holy Week, a proposal to pray, meditate, celebrate and share together, centering ourselves on the Gospel of the day and our JM spirituality, in the light of the Charism of Claudine. The invitation was that each one, from her home, alone or with the persons with whom she lives, could carry out the activity proposed and share it with her ASJM Group.

In this way, we could experience that we were all together celebrating the Passion and Resurrection of Jesus.

We received a response that over-flowed our expectations. Not only from the ASJM Groups, but also from many persons linked to JM who joined us.

It is very hard to see every day, persons close to us, die. We continue to be in a rigid lock down, up to July 10. Nevertheless, we hope in God, that sooner or later, this sanitary crisis will end.

Here in Cochabamba (Bolivia), we have a small group, but it functions well.

We used to meet once a month and shared on some passage of the Bible or of the Congregation and our life. We have a commitment to hand in every time we meet a certain amount of money, which at the end of the year is used for a solidarity purpose. Even though not as an activity of the group, some of the members have been going to a center for catechism to the migrants. Now during the pandemic each one is staying at home. We communicate by telephone, and for those who have WhatsApp. We have sent them a copy of the Memorial, the oldest document of the Congregation, so that you can read it little by little and comment on it when we meet again. Dr. Eleuterio Sánchez, member of the group, is a doctor who works in a faraway place out in the country, and he tells us that the peasants who live in houses, which are separated one from the other and have there all they need in food, etc, do not have to go out to the city and so there is no contagion of the virus. However, in other places it is very sad to watch on TV or listen to the difficulties in which many families live. There is much contagion. Several persons have been found dead on the street. The hospitals are full, and this even here in our city. Some of those who are infected are persons close to us whom we know. Some have recovered and are cured; others are struggling trying to be cured and others have died.

All the members of the group are well and healthy, thank God; we pray for those who suffer materially and spiritually (Sickness, nourishment, economy, dead, etc.) We wish all the groups health, peace, and trust knowing that God is close to them.







Sharing AFJM at the level of the Congregation

This time of lock down has been surprising and of mixed feelings: fear, sadness, pain, suffering, anguish because of the situation being lived at personal, family, social and world level. It has also been a favorable time of being closer to all by prayer and reflection. This has helped to be more conscious or aware of the passing of the Lord in our personal history and of changing our way of thinking, feeling, acting.

The telephone has been a resource to be in contact and to be interested for each family; the majority are elderly of the third age,

I was also connected with six whatsapp groups of children from 8th 9th and 10th, exams being cancelled, and finding themselves in such an uncertain situation, these teenagers were frightened and were losing hope.

I would message them every day, discouraging them from watching news and encouraging them to pray to Mother Claudine every day. We, on the group prayed for the doctors, nurses, scientists, leaders and for those infected, for their recovery. Sending them words of hope and keeping their faith alive was my motto during almost 3 months of lockdown. It was nice to hear what they had to say too. Their sharing's about faith and hope kept the candle of hope burning for others.. Those who celebrated birthdays alone, we cheered them up and wished them online.

Reflections on the AFJM Project in Canada

Here we present the first work that we have lived as members of the AFJM in relation to the Charism.

I share this with you since we have lived it with great renewed enthusiasm received from Saint Claudine and the lived experience of JM reflected in its preferences. Above all, in the knowledge or movement of going deeper into her Charism, and in our desire to be similar to our Foundress. There is the impression that this community is being founded under her look continually updating itself. This pedagogy allows us to accept what a Charism is and to become familiar to its action in our daily life.

We are grateful for receiving us under her creative look of love and goodness, which allows us to advance in the knowledge of our God so concerned for our world.

I am adding the document of Consuelo Mengal as a beginning reading of our search and I attach textually the result of the sharing of the members.

1- Family spirit: The Charism

The Charism is grace: a grace for the Church and for the world. This Charism is a human face, a community face; it is updated by a life style, which is called, like Saint Claudine, to reflect the goodness of God in our society and our communities. The credibility of the Charism is judged by the capacity of generating life and life in abundance, not only in the world through our apostolate, but also in our communities by sharing the mission, Laity and Religious, making today, a reality the road traced by Saint Claudine.

In these communities of life and faith, we learn to love Jesus and Mary feeling that we are one family, sharing and accompanying our joys and sufferings, as well as that of the persons around us. We feel that the Charism has strengthened and consolidated our faith, our hope and our charity. It has given us a profound filial and fraternal sense, which has made us more sensitive to the needs, and has urged us to work in the service and surrender to the mission, united to the Religious in their humane Projects, accompanying, educating, curing, healing and giving dignity to our lives since we are also persons who suffer.

We desire to continue as persons being sent to be witnesses of the Love of God in our realities, which are close to us – family, work, neighborhood, as leaven, salt and light.

The Bicentenary has celebrated Claudine, women of faith, pardon and communion and now, as Sister Monica Joseph, RJM told us, "We desire to continue our journey with Claudine, with hope as an apostolic family. The flame of the Charism is in our hands, it belongs to them, it belongs to me, it belongs to us. It is our treasure but also our responsibility for the future generations, so that our world will be better. We know we can count on you to nourish this sacred fire".

Objective 1: Recognize that the Charism helps us to grow in faith, makes us feel that we are a family, offers us a spirituality, which models or shapes us in a way of being, in the world.

Lines of action:

• To grow in the knowledge of the life of Saint Claudine and of her way of living the Gospel.

Questions of Louise and the responses of her members:

a) What is a Charism for you?

A charism is:

- A gift from God, which is greater than oneself.
- Something accepted.
- Something, which is acquired, that one has the obligation to develop it, to share, and which demands will.
- Something like an attitude shown in a person that makes her attractive, loving, and that one is happy to listen to her, to know her, to imitate her.
- The goodness of heart
- A unique and exceptional way of being, of living which has influence
- Something, which comes from the Spirit and gives wings, places one on the way,
- Something of which we are the instruments
- Something, which creates bonds, attracts others, inspires trust.
- The expression of qualities, of gifts that a person has.
- The whole values or virtues that mark a person or a group and is reflected in their behavior, their attitude.
- Something, which one feels like an interior peace.
- Something, which creates light, makes one feel well, joy.
- What is transparent from the interior, what is indwelling, without the need of speaking, of words.

b) How would you call that of Saint Claudine?

Goodness/ Charity/ Pardon/ Sharing/ Love/ Peace/ Gift of self/ Acceptance/ Openness to others/ Altruism/ Attention to others/ Joy of living/ Respect/ Availability/ Mercy/ Absolute Trust in the will of God/Obedience/ Solid Faith/ Woman sustained by God/ Transparency of the Love of God.

Has it happened to you that in your daily life the Charism of Saint Claudine has helped you to find the good life in you... around you?

• In you.

- -When I pray to Claudine every day to ask for her help, it does me good.
- -When my father was hospitalized that, I asked Mother Claudine that he could have a room, and it was granted,
- -When a prayer meeting is prepared for a group or a celebration in the comment of the Prayer that helps me to be humble to listen to myself, of what is happening interiorly.

- -This is seen in my pastoral educational work, in the education to young people, of children, in the groups to which I belong, when I accompany and when I am available.
- -Frequently when I educate my children, I would take the model in the form of doing of Mother Claudine, in the education that she gave to the children who were under her care and I asked for her help, her patience and goodness. This gave me peace, strength and trust.
- -When I help my parents, brothers, and sisters during sickness.
- -When I help others, when I renew my hope, when I give joy to others, and when I work in favor of justice.
- -When my son had difficulties I entrusted him to Saint Claudine.
- -When I help my sons.
- When I pardoned or forgave.
- -When I help others, when I love them and have compassion.
- -When I work as a Volunteer, when I am altruist.
- -When I accept what Jesus asks me, it fills me with joy, and the weight disappears.
- -When I think on the charism of Goodness and Mercy of Claudine which has been transmitted through her daughters (the Religious), it has helped me very much up until now, in my daily life.

Around me

- -When I saw someone defend another person who was living intimidation.
- -When I saw the auxiliary nurses treat their patients with respect-
- -When I saw the children visit their elderly relatives.
- -When our children helped us during the time of sickness and were present in an extraordinary manner for us.
- -When I saw the JM Religious visit the sick and took time to listen to them.
- -When I saw the Religious accompany some persons in the car when they needed it.
- -When I look at the sun set.
- -When I see the empathy of persons in tragic moments.
- -When we meet and we help one another and in this way, friendship is developed.
- -When I see the goodness in the persons of a group.
- -When my son did his work by himself, now he is happier and accepts himself as he is.
- -When I see the persons in our group who radiate goodness and trust in the Spirit.
- -When I received many signs of love in the funeral of my father.
- -When I see persons who trust in life.
- -When I see that the person who need help are helped
- -When I see persons who love their neighbor as themselves.
- -When I needed to trust and someone took the time to listen to me.
- -When I saw the patience of the persons who accompany the children in Pastoral Ministry.
- -When I collaborated in the groups of Scouts and "Jannettes", etc.
- -When I see persons leave their ego aside and become instruments of God.
- -When I see all those volunteers who exercise goodness in hospitals and in centers of elderly persons.

- -When I become aware that the qualities of our good Mother Claudine are the same that Jesus lived.
- -The persons who even if they are in mourning, give themselves generously day after day, to comfort and sustain.
- The persons who work because they love their neighbor and they never refuse anything asked of them.
- -The persons who give themselves completely for the opening of the Chapel.
- -The persons who write words of consolation and full of love to encourage, to congratulate, or greet.
- -The persons who pray for those who need it.

A look, after the encounter, at what has been lived to assimilate the discoveries of last month.

- A- Which are some **elements of our last encounter repeated** after a month, since we met? What have you kept from this encounter?
- B- Did these elements sustain your desire (have given you more pleasure, encouragement) of living and knowing more this force of life of the FJM?
- -Now we understand better what the word "Charism" means.
- -It has made us become aware, that each one, has a different Charism-
- -This changed my look. My way of looking at others goes beyond; I look at them without judging. We are all children of God; I see more rapidly the good side of persons.
- It leads me even more to look at the greatness of the souls of the persons whom we meet.
- -The beauty of others is more visible.
- -We should not compare one another. Each one contributes something particular.
- -Be aware that we all have a different Charism. This makes me know that it is important to listen to whom we are, of what others are as well. This helps discernment, which is an essential element to live in truth.
- -The Charism of each one makes a group diverse and at the same time, it complements.
- -The talents and qualities of each one constitute the strength of the group.
- -The force of the life of the FJM has its roots in the Charism of Claudine Thévenet of which, we members of the JM family, benefit by grace, and gives us the joy of living and propagating the goodness and the mercy of God in our daily life, around us in the world.


