I.- INTRODUCTORY BIBLICAL TEXTS TO REFLECT, PRAY AND SHARE.

W The biblical text of The Visitation of Mary to Elizabeth. Lc. 1,39-56 that will accompany and enlighten the General Chapter invites us to pray from gratefulness:

Mary naturally sets out to serve. The meeting between Elizabeth and the Virgin is a song of joy and praise, both witnesses and of the grace that has made them fruitful. Mary is grateful for what God has done in her, because she keeps her promise and has done wonders for her people. The Magnificat is a foretaste of the Beatitudes, a compendium of the Gospel and makes explicit the way of God.

Before Elizabeth's affectionate greeting, Mary opens her heart in indescribable praise. It is the heart of Mary that represents all of us, it is the soul of Israel, it is the soul of humanity that recognizes the wonders of God in her own life: «My soul sings the greatness of the Lord, and my spirit trembles with joy in God, my savior, because he looked with kindness on the smallness of your servant. From now on all generations will call me happy, because the Almighty has done great things in me: His Name is holy! His mercy extends from generation to generation about those who fear it. He unfolded the strength of his arm, scattered the proud of heart. He overthrew the powerful of his throne and elevated the humble. He filled the hungry with goods and dismissed the rich with empty hands. He helped Israel, his servant, remembering his mercy, as he had promised our parents, in favor of Abraham and his descendants forever ».



In prayer everyone can make their own Magnificat: what are the wonders that God has done in my life, my heart, my family, my people?

"I will not leave you, if you do not bless me" (Gn 32: 23-34).

"Because where our treasure is, there will also be our heart" (Mt 6, 21).

Jesus may have wanted to say that when we decide and determine to find good (our treasure) that is when we will feel gratitude (in our heart). Gratitude arises in our consciousness, begins in us, but does not have to stay there. The fullness of gratitude comes when we experience it and express it in our daily activities and in our relationships.

When we are grateful we create a space of security, peace, love, and joy, and people trust us, enjoy being around us, establish wonderful spiritual connections that make us see the presence of God.

Active gratitude is what gives and not only receives; it is a way of living, a way of being.

II.-THE VIRTUE OF THANKS.

In a world where individualism prevails, a reflection on gratitude can help to understand how gratitude humanizes and promotes communion among brothers.

If we observe, our society does not move by freely giving, but is given to obtain an economic benefit, as an organized satisfaction, of a social pact.

The gratitude, experienced as a personal gift, should be:

1.- Between people, as a personal encounter.

2.- Free and voluntary. Nobody can force us to be grateful.

3.- With respect towards who receives the gratitude.

He who helps or does something for others should not do it with superiority, but with humility.

There are times when one experiences the need to give thanks for the existence of the other. This gratitude, unconsciously, is directed to God.

In our relationships the word "thank you" and love must be coordinated. The word straight is that which is always pronounced with love.

From this consideration, thanksgiving is a basic experience of love communication.

When gratitude is really profound, it is transformed into actions.

Thus, in gratitude there is an element of knowledge of the good received and another element of response that moves us to express it. We can not live isolated, but related to each other because mutual help enriches us. Gratitude implies that I recognize the other person and that is how solidarity begins.

And from gratitude to the close brother we walk towards gratitude towards God as one of the basic virtues of the Christian spiritual life. Gratitude for the gifts received in our lives encourages salvation, frees us from negativity and despair. This is the strength of gratitude in the face of envy, which is a break with the true reality of our existence. Prayer always springs from humility before the mystery of God that moves us to thanksgiving.

Gratitude is an answer to the love of God, awakens man. The grateful person is not a superficial person, but a profound person, who lives in the key of humility and recognition of God.

Gratitude always seeks to be expressed. It is not by chance that thanksgiving occupies such an important place in the liturgical one. Let us remember, for this, the three great hymns: Benedictus (Lk 1, 68-69), Magnificat (Lk 1, 46-55), and Nunc dimittis (Lk 2, 29-32).

Gratitude essentially includes joy and gratitude is a fundamental source of happiness.

III.- LOVE AND GRATITUDE.

"There is more joy in giving than in receiving" (Acts 20, 35). We need a society where gratitude is inseparable from life. We can not take everything for granted, but work against superficiality and banality. Thus, gratitude is the fundamental answer to every gift that always has its first motive in love.

Simple reasons to be grateful:

"Look at the sky, contemplate it and just have to say thank you, for all that I have lived, for a wonderful year, for life, family, friends, employment, people with a good heart, for each trip, for each brother, for the celebration of the 200 years we lived. For a wonderful God who is all love and takes us to unexpected places to know his mercy.

To thank all those who were present in our lives, new confreres of faith, new challenges, new ideas, different ways of seeing life always under the protection of God, the same intention to be better people every day with the desire to make known and love Jesus and Mary. Thank because for God and those who follow the barriers do not exist, distances are reduced, dreams are increased, thanks for the emotions that are born to move the soul, thank for each life story, for all those who give their whole lives to generate more life.

For all that you have given us, good God, I give you infinite graces.

Thanks God for everything!..."

LIVE GRATEFUL

"In the Ignatian proposal of life we are invited to make gratitude the basic attitude of our existence as creatures loved and given by God. I allow myself to translate the Ignatian "praise" for our concrete and daily life as the attitude of "thankfulness", to live gratefully, gratefully. Praise should not be just a mouth-to-mouth action, but something lived in the heart, and that praise in the heart, as a habitual attitude and not just as a punctual event, is to be grateful.

That "gratefulness" in the background, that living from gratitude, is not favored by the environmental culture that encourages us to be more aware of what we do not have than of what is given to us abundantly

... From gratitude springs an inner state of joy, availability and agility in responding to the demands of life, a more lively sensibility to perceive everything that daily life has a gift, a greater generosity as a vital attitude, a less tension for not receiving compensations or rewards to our action.

For all these words are so true and accurate Ignatian words and intuition that in the "Principle and Foundation" we say that "praise," "thank" is one of those attitudes by which the creature, that creature that we are each one of us, "saves his soul", "saves his life", not because it leads to the beyond, but because it fills her with meaning and human and divine fulfillment in the everyday here. "

To live grateful to God for the YES of Claudina, a woman of praise expressed in her "sensitivity, availability and agility in giving answers to the demands of life"

To live grateful to God for Jesus Mary today, who with great force calls us to simplicity of heart to go out to meet the most fragile and vulnerable of our society.

To live grateful to God because we are invited to fill our lives with meaning and fulfillment by following the path of the Spiritual Exercises and as Molla sj expresses, "to take care of our gratitude, to keep it alive and active; That is why this daily "examination" of the benefits received by Ignacio, as soon as the Exercises begin, is important. This small and simple exercise will be for us an incredible fecundity and situates our daily life in a totally different dynamic. "

To live gratefully, always uttering and in every place like Claudina, HOW GOOD IS GOD! , fruit of a fruitful and founding life of praise.
